3. **Admission Status:** A sizable number of individuals are admitted successfully, though there are cases of unsuccessful discharge and those leaving against medical advice, highlighting potential challenges in the rehabilitation process.
4. **Age Distribution:** The population skews towards middle-aged individuals, with the average age being around 40 years old. This suggests that the criminal justice system deals with a mature population.
5. **Education Level:** A majority of individuals have completed at least a high school education or obtained a GED, though there are a few cases where education level is not available.
