

THE PROGRAM for Offenders, Inc.
Alcohol and Drug Treatment
Annual Report
Year 2019

THE PROGRAM for Offenders, Inc. provides Alcohol and Drug treatment to individuals involved in the Criminal Justice System. Allegheny County Treatment Alternatives (ACTA) provided services to men in Allegheny County in 2019. These services are designed to meet individual needs and include individual and group therapy sessions as well as psycho-educational lectures. All information presented in this report will be from the first day of the year, January 1, 2019 until the end of the year on December 31, 2019. There were 36 residents who had completed their intake in 2018 but were released from the facility or discharged from inpatient treatment in 2018. Their information will only be included in the sections regarding discharges, whether they were contacted post TX or had partaken in schooling/job training while in treatment, but not in the new enrollments, choice of drugs, or whether or not they had a GED or High School Diploma as they were noted on the 2018 report for these categories.

During the year of 2019, 190 residents were enrolled into treatment at ACTA. The breakdown for new enrollments was as follows: 111 residents reported Caucasian (58%), 72 residents reported African American (38%), 4 residents reported Biracial (2%) and 3 residents reported Hispanic (2%). ACTA is currently an all male facility.

The breakdown for choice of drugs among ACTA enrollments for 2019 was as follows: 86 (45%) residents reported Opiates, 37 (19%) reported Cocaine/Crack Cocaine, 44 (23%) reported Alcohol, 16 (8%) reported Marijuana, 3 (2%) reported Amphetamines, 2 (1%) reported Hallucinogens, and 2 (1%) reported Benzodiazepines.

ACTA discharged a total of 213 clients from treatment in 2019. Of these 213 discharges, 52 (24%) were successfully paroled via the court system, 48 (23%) were revoked to the county jail, 30 (14%) left AMA, 9 (4%) escaped, 20 (9%) were unsuccessfully discharged for either behavioral or administrative reasons, 5 (2%) were successfully discharged who were not part of the jail system and 49 (23%) were successfully discharged to a lower level of care (Outpatient/Intensive Outpatient) and moved into THE PROGRAM's Transitional Living Facility (TLF). Upon intake, the clients agreed to allow us to contact them 30 days after their discharge to note their progress. Eighty-two clients were reached and reported being stable with improvement in their lives.

With regards to employment, 125 residents at ACTA were assisted with Job Readiness/Job Search and had obtained employment in 2018, 82 (66%) residents gained employment and of the 43 (34%) who were not employed, 2 (1%) were enrolled in school. Only 40 (21%) of all new residents reported not having a GED or High School Diploma.

THE PROGRAM for Offenders, Inc. generated an income of \$4,546,606 and total expenses of \$3,816,144 for the fiscal year 2019.
